Parent / Teacher Interviews:

It's been wonderful to see so many parents at school for the parent / teacher interviews. It is a good opportunity to hear how your children are progressing with their learning so I encourage you all to take advantage of the opportunity. It is hard to believe we are close to half way through our second term! Assessments will be occurring later this month and early in June, with our report cards issued in the first week of Term 3.

Mother's Day:

Thank you to our P&C and a small band of helpers who did such a great job of our Mother's Day stall last week. I hope all our Mum's had a great day and the gifts brought a smile to your faces last Sunday!

COVID.19:

COVID continues to impact on us all. At school we continue to have staff and students who are affected and unable to attend. Recently however, the Queensland Government has updated the requirements for anyone who is deemed a close contact of a confirmed Case of COVID-19.

New requirements for close contacts:

From 6pm on Thursday 28 April 2022, close contacts who do not have COVID-19 symptoms no longer need to quarantine.

Students who are close contacts must notify their school that they are a close contact. It is recommended that students undertake a rapid antigen test (RAT) on the first day they leave home, and every second day (e.g. days 2, 4, and 6) until they are no longer a close contact.

Close contacts who develop COVID-19 symptoms must not attend school and should isolate until their symptoms resolve.

If you or your child tests positive to COVID-19

Queensland Health requirements for people who test positive to COVID-19 remain unchanged. You must follow the Queensland Health guidelines outlined in the first steps to take if you have COVID-19.



SPOTLIGHT ON HASS

(Humanities and Social Sciences)

I hope that the spotlight on each Learning Area of the Australian Curriculum is providing an insight in to the work your children engage with at school. We continue our journey by taking a closer look at HASS.

In a world that is increasingly culturally diverse and dynamically interconnected, it is important that students come to understand their world, past and present, and develop a capacity to respond to challenges, now and in the future, in innovative, informed, personal and collective ways.

The Australian Curriculum for the Humanities and Social Sciences (HASS) plays an important role in harnessing students' curiosity and imagination about the world they live in and empowers them to actively shape their lives; make reflective, informed decisions; value their belonging in a diverse and dynamic society; and positively contribute locally, nationally, regionally and globally.

Students engage in curriculum that develops a range of skills to enable them to make informed decisions and solve problems. The subject provides students with the skills, behaviours capabilities that will equip them to face challenges in their lifetime and to participate in and contribute to the wellbeing and sustainability of the environment, the economy and society. Through studying Humanities and Social Sciences, students are given opportunities to develop their ability to question, think critically, solve problems, communicate effectively, make decisions and adapt to change.

Through the Humanities and Social Sciences, students become well placed to contribute to Australia's ideas of a cohesive society, sustainable environment, productive economy and stable democracy.

In fact, our Year 6 students are about to embark on a trip to Brisbane to visit Parliament House after learning about the importance of people, institutions, and processes to Australia's democracy and legal system. I'm sure they'll have a wonderful time exploring Parliament and learning first hand about our democratic system.
